


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

Overview of the Liver Forum



- What: a platform for <u>ongoing</u> multi-stakeholder dialogue to identify barriers, prioritize research and identify solutions to accelerate therapeutic development for MASLD/MASH
- How: provide a neutral, independent, safe space for discussion and deliberation across stakeholder groups
 - Focus on developing consensus, increasing synergy and collaboration, and reducing duplication and uncertainty
 - Ongoing working group activity throughout the year anchored by larger project events
 - Active & engaged participation



Forum Operating Principles



- Independent and neutral venue
 - Ongoing multi-stakeholder dialogue
 - Each stakeholder group has an equal voice
- Facilitate best science-based decisions, in real time
 - Break down inefficiencies and redundancy
 - Increase clarity, collaboration and innovation

Forum = Safe Space






