



Call to Action for a PSC-Specific ICD-10 Code An urgent need for PSC research

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Letter of Request to the CDC

"As a practicing hepatologist in an academic center specializing in this disease, I have experienced the frustrations attempting to handle administrative data related to PSC and have no doubts that these frustrations are shared by other investigators in this field. PSC is a rare disease with many challenges to overcome, but a simple change in coding would remove many barriers we have to understanding the epidemiology, natural history, and practice patterns related to PSC."

Rationale for Needing a PSC-Specific Code

- To facilitate robust epidemiological and natural history studies
- To select the correct cohort of patients
- To enable early and better identification and assessment of therapeutic outcomes
- To obtain better information on comorbidities and adverse effects
- To bring to light the multifactorial nature of PSC and to identify the burdens on patients



Progress to Date

- Proposal submission by PSC Partners to the ICD Coordination and Maintenance Committee
- Input and guidance from Chris Bowlus and Gideon Hirschfield
- Invited to testify at the September 13th meeting video online
- Comment period until November 13th
