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

Patient Assistance Programs

- There are currently approximately 20,000-30,000 patients utilizing HIV PAPs.
- Analysis indicates that PAPs serve patients who are in transition between longer term methods of coverage and typically stay in a PAP less than one year.







Patient Assistance Programs

- Pharmaceutical companies have been strong partners and are fulfilling their obligation to provide life saving medications to patients who would otherwise go untreated.
- With revenue from HIV medications now exceeding \$10 billion per year, pharmaceutical companies continue to have adequate resources to support PAPs.

The HarborPath Common Portal

Develop a common application form

All PAP enrollment forms serve the same purpose; BUT there are differences in:

- Type and amount of data requested for the same purpose.
- Requirements for supporting paperwork.
- The number and types of signatures required.

Streamline eligibility under HarborPath

- Simplify and standardize income determination/verification.
- Print a blank copy of the common form.
- Complete the common form on-line.

Improve prescription compliance

• Single pharmacy with delivery options, refills and medication assistance that meets patient and care manager needs, including real-time information about status of eligibility and prescription fulfillment.

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- NASTAD and The Clinton Health Access Initiative (CHAI) launched HarborPath (HP) to address eligibility processing and prescription fulfillment.
- HarborPath is a collaborative undertaking between pharmaceutical firms, NASTAD, donors, government agencies and advocacy groups.
- HarborPath has completed software development for the common portal and can process all company PAP forms.





- HarborPath has reached agreement with ViiV and Merck to supply medications.
- Discussions continue with Gilead, Johnson & Johnson, Abbott and Bristol-Myers Squibb.
- Beginning in 2013 HarborPath will have Hep C medications available.





HarborPath Progress Report

- HP has contracted with MedVantx, an innovative consumer medication management and delivery company.
- The state of the art home delivery pharmacy, operating out of Sioux Falls, South Dakota, serves as a full line mail service prescription drug and information provider. MedVantx operates a 35,000 square foot facility and is licensed in all 50 states.
