






- FQHCs are ideal locations to meet the complex needs of underserved patients.
- Few PCPs have adequate training in HCV treatment
- PCPs have limited access to specialists for consultation or referral



Structural Features



- 2 hour weekly sessions, alternating HIV/Hep C

 - PharmD
 - Case management RN
 - Psych APRN





Project Accomplishments

- Replication at a large, multisite FQHC
- Full EHR integration
- Multipoint videoconferencing technology
- Treatment plans developed for 96 unique patients

Project Challenges

- Provider time:
 - 2 hrs per clinician per week
- Specialist time
 - Multidisciplinary team of specialists 2 hrs per week plus prep time for didactic, preparation time
- Substantial lead time to initiate treatment
- Project ECHO is nonreimbursed by most health plans
