


- Training & consultation that connects rural providers with ANTHC liver disease specialists in Anchorage

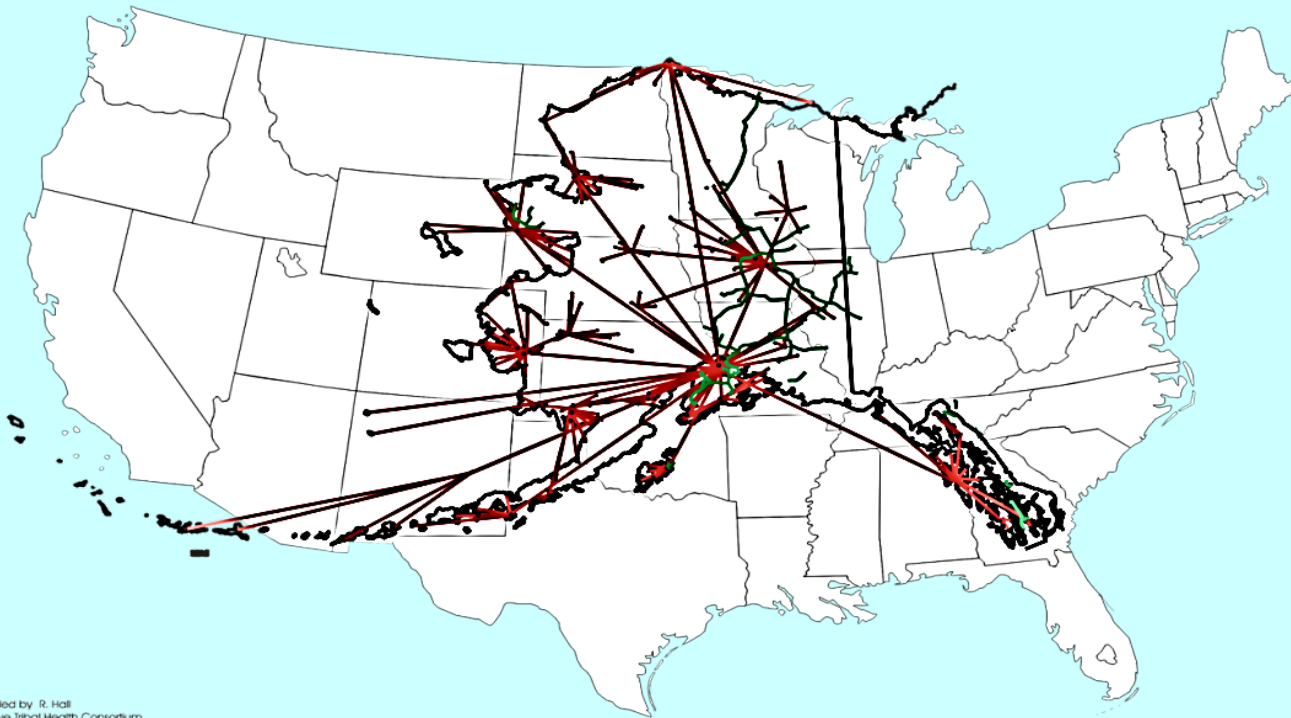

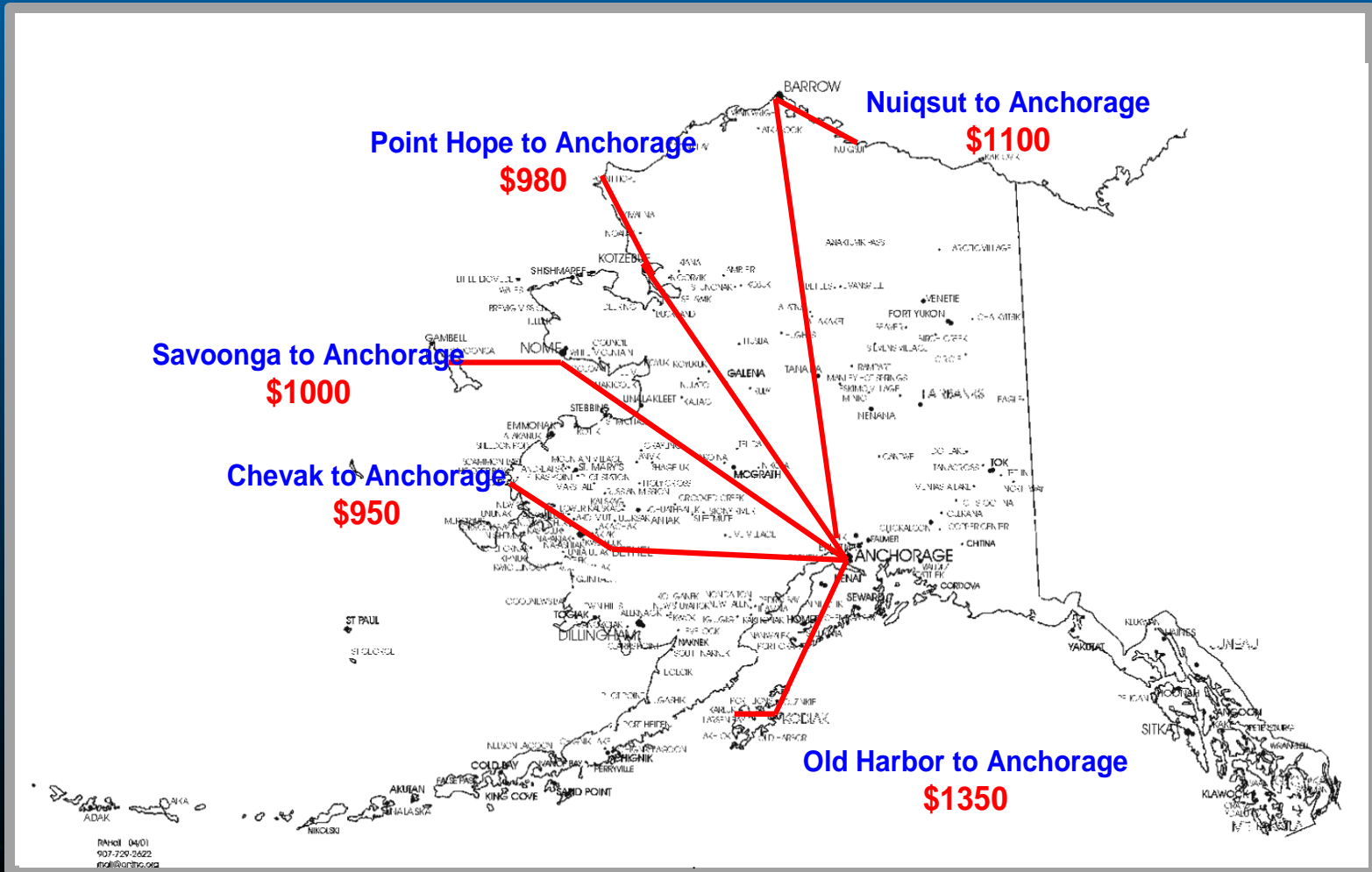
